

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

July was a catastrophic month for our beloved Hill Country area. Our hearts go out to the families, friends and neighbors affected by the flooding. Providing charitable support to our communities is an important cause in all PCA regions. LHR Board and Council met to discuss how our region could collectively contribute to the recovery needs. Rather than contribute to a general fund, we decided to focus our efforts on a single cause. With the suggestion and information provided by Cindy Elizondo, we agreed to directly support the Center Point Volunteer Fire Department. Their fire station was gutted by flood waters, ruining equipment, fire gear, furniture, supplies and a stockpile of food purchased for their big July Picnic fundraising event. With your generous support, LHR members donated \$4665 to this charity drive. We added \$2500 from our LHR funds for a total contribution of \$7165. On August 1st, we drove out to Center Point and hand delivered our LHR donation supporting their Fire Station rebuilding needs. Thank you to all for supporting this fundraiser. It will certainly make an impact on their Fire Station recovery.

Gather with PCA friends on September 13th to celebrate PCA's 70th official anniversary date. The Weiswurm's will host our Oktoberfest themed Picnic Celebration at their beautiful property in Garden Ridge. We'll enjoy a smokehouse assortment from True Texas BBQ along with side dishes and desserts provided by our members. ### Flood Relief ~ Center Point Volunteer Fire Department

Friday morning August 1 was the perfect day for a ride to present the Center Point Fire Dept. our Longhorn Region donation. President Chris Royter led the ride accompanied by his wife, club secretary Dan and Rick & myself made up the small group. We met up at 1604

& 10 to travel to Center Point. The closer we got to the Fire Dept the more we could see evidence of the flooding. Trees & debris were everywhere. As were signs saying, "Hill Country



Strong", "Thank You Volunteers" and green ribbons around many trees and poles.

We were a little early for our meeting with Chief



Holt, so we traveled on to Kerrville. Our first stop was the memorial that stretches a block on an installed fence for this purpose. While it was hard to look at all those lost. I felt honored to be able to see them and acknowledge their loss. You may leave notes, pictures or other items at the memorial. We then went to a local restaurant and had a delicious meal with great ice tea! We headed back to meet and present the club's check to Chief Holt. We were fortunate to also meet Firefighter Doke who talked about his driving a Porsche when he was in the military at a base in Germany during the 70's. His Commanding Officer owned one but was afraid of it so once a month he would ask him to take it out and open it up to make

sure it ran well.

Chris brought Longhorn region hats which we presented



to Mr. Doke and Chief Holt. Then we presented the check with our donations to Chief Holt. He thanked us, discussing how they are getting the Fire Dept. back in shape and the equipment they lost but planning to be prepared for disasters of this nature by looking towards an Air Boat, Sherp with trailer, Zodiac swift water rescue boat with motor & trailer and a pickup truck suitable for gooseneck towing. At 4 a.m. on July 4th while rescuing people in Hunt, TX the team knew Center Point would be hit hard soon so they sent word to the remaining staff to be aware and evacuate as best as possible, which they did. The evidence of the flood was everywhere around the Fire Dept. We were honored to be able to present these deserving first responders with the Longhorn Region donation. If you would like to support them in their needs you

In partnership with the Cajun Navy there is now a live GOFUNDME to help CPVFD to rebuild what was

The volunteers are still working tirelessly but as we thanked them, we could see not only the toll it was taking on them but also their determination to stay "Hill Country Strong". As a fellow Texan I could not be prouder that we stepped up to help our fellow Texans.



On Saturday, June 7, 2025, 9 cars and 17 people from Longhorn PCA participated in a Time, Speed, Distance (TSD) Rally from Bergheim to Driftwood.

A TSD Rally presents unique challenges to the driver and navigator. In addition to following the route laid out in the directions, each team must manage its speed to arrive at the timing locations as close to the planned time as possible. Given the vagaries of traffic, construction, traffic signals, and other unpredictable factors, this is a dynamic challenge requiring close measurement, good calculation, clear communication, and lots of flexibility. To add complication (simplification?), we used the Richta Rally application for the first time, to track cars via GPS and calculate scores automatically.

The overall route ran generally through Kendalia, Sisterdale, Fredericksburg, Johnson City and Dripping Springs. The roads varied from the sweeping turns and vistas of FM 473 and 1323, to the relatively twisty and rural Old San Antonio Road, and the rough but beautiful and challenging Fitzhugh Road south of Pedernales State Park. Because of the recent rains, the Texas Hill Country was delightfully green and lush. Even the unobservant could see Cenizo bushes in full blush, a regular post-precipitation treat in south-central Texas. Flat Creek flowing over Fitzhugh Road was good for a splash and a smile, although easier in a Cayenne than a 911.

We ended the day at Vista Brewing in Driftwood. They generously provided VIP roped off parking, a long, reserved table, good burgers and beer. The seasonal Victor Bravo West Coast Imperial IPA was quite tasty.

The final results in the Richta Scoreboard showed

Chuck Bush and Mikel Matthews in 3rd place with 501 points,





Steve Bonnette and Gregory Arnold in 2nd place with 336 points, and

David and Kortnee Valdivieso in 1st place with 304 points.

Win or lose, everyone was smiling.

# The Porsche Macan ..... it grows on you

Let me introduce this by saying when the Macan first came out, I wanted very much not to like it as many have asked the question, why does Porsche, a sports car company, need yet another SUV and a smaller one at that? Over the years, my opinion has changed. I've driven probably every different model of the Macan and finally I am convinced, it's a pretty nice vehicle and a sporty one at that.

Well, last year after I broke my hip (another story) and had to have it replaced the doctor said that I probably shouldn't try to get in my recently purchased 2018 911T for at least 4 to 6 months. So somewhat down, my good friend Dan Faerber, the general manager at Porsche San Antonio,

suggested I look at a Macan GTS, which I did and bought one. Naturally, anybody that knows me, knows I've got to have all the performance goodies,



leather interior, 18 way seats, sport chrono plus etc. and we found one and in blue.... even better.

Also owning a Cayenne, I was able to compare one to another. The Macan is smaller, has less head and leg room in the rear seating than the Cayenne and less luggage space in the rear however, if you don't normally carry large adults in the rear and want a more sporty vehicle, the Macan may just fit your bill. It did mine.

The Macan is lighter and much more nimble than the Cayenne, which is a very nimble SUV. If you get the GTS version of the Macan with all the performance options, you can change ride height and shock setting on the fly as well as transmission programming.

I drive mine at least 50 to 75% of the time in manual mode and love it. Of course, I added a set of GT 3 RS paddles which makes the experience even better. While nothing is

perfect, and if I could dream, the Macan GTS with a third pedal and six speed manual would come close. And how about Porsche ceramic brakes. We could label it a Macan RS.

Speaking of driving and we were, while the Macan is not a 911, it comes pretty darn close on twisty roads and is pure fun to drive. The brakes are adequate (PCCBs would be better). The acceleration, with over 400 hp in a six cylinder twin turbo engine, is more than adequate - in fact it's great.

So what don't I like about the Macan? Mine is a 2024 GTS

and I'm definitely not a fan of adaptive cruise control. I would much prefer basic cruise control. Other than that, there is nothing I don't like. It's quiet and it's nimble with very good acceleration and braking. It's



easy to park and easy to maneuver. If my neck wasn't so bad I'd love to take it on the track. Yes, if available I would've ordered PCCB brakes.

The Macan base and S are also both good cars with four-cylinder engines, which I'm not a fan of, and are enjoyable transportation and for many will fill the bill when a 911 just won't do it with small kids. That said I'll have to admit that fifty years ago Sandy and I went from Florida to Arizona with our two small kids in our 1966 Porsche 912. Today we would consider that foolish but back then we were young.

Now, if you think you might want a Macan, don't delay because the word is Porsche will quit building the gasoline engine version of the Macan next year and after that only the all electric will be available. Probably not the smartest decision since the Macan sells so very well, but then what can I say? It's their company. So there you have it - one man's evolution from not liking the Porsche Macan to owning a GTS version and very happy with it.

#### Schnell Fest at COTA

The Austin Schnell Fest is hosted by the Hill Country, Lone Star, and Maverick Regions of PCA, along with the Houston Chapter BMW - CCA, and takes place twice a year at Circuit of the Americas (COTA) in the spring and fall. Details can be found on austinschnellfest. clubregistration.net. Schnell Fest is open to drivers of all makes of cars and experience levels. What makes this event especially great for drivers who are new to the track is the Intro to High Performance Driver Education (HPDE) that is offered to new drivers only.

Space is limited, and I was lucky enough to get a slot for Intro to HPDE. I was assigned to the Noon – 5:00 PM slot on Saturday, March 8, 2025. I was also fortunate to be assigned to Hank Smith, a Chief Driving Instructor,

I ended the day with
so much fun and

understanding of track driving and the dynamics of my car.

I had an exhilarating, fun, educational experience in the Schnell Fest driving the 3.4 mile circuit at COTA in my 2024 Porsche 718 Cayman GTS 4.0.


The day started with my tech inspection.

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


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### Porsche of San Antonio Open House

For some background - the Porsche dealership in San Antonio was originally combined with the Audi dealership. Porsche was then acquired separately in 1990 and became the Porsche Center on September 19, 1990. They then acquired the former Porsche Audi building and their Volvo dealership joined them shortly afterwards. Throughout the next decade, sales grew steadily. In 2001 the Porsche Center moved to

Fredericksburg Road and sold Porsche's exclusively. Over the next decade new models were introduced including the Cayenne, Carrera GT, and the Panamera. Then, in 2011, Porsche Center was renamed Porsche of San Antonio. To add to the excitement of the new name, they were named the first LEED Gold Certified Porsche dealership in the world! (LEED – Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design – a green building rating system). Three years later in 2014, the Macan was introduced followed by the 918 in 2015. As sales continued to climb, they quickly ran out of room. So, construction began on a new building on H-10 West and was completed in 2023.

The new dealership is larger, and they have added more service bays to accommodate the demand from Porsche owners. Thanks to Don Faerber and his team for hosting a wonderful event and for Porsche of San Antonio being a long-time sponsor of LHR.

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

# Time travel: Porsche presents selected cars at Retro Classics

13/02/2025 Porsche invites Retro Classics 2025 visitors to an exciting journey that combines the past, present and future of the sports car. From 27 February to 2 March 2025, the company from Zuffenhausen will set up in Hall 1 to present a carefully curated selection of cars that not only make the captivation of the Porsche brand tangible, but also provide deep insights into the Porsche Heritage and Museum areas.

Retro Classics in Stuttgart is not just a trade fair — it is a meeting place for classic car fans and sports car enthusiasts from all over the world. From Thursday, 27 February to Sunday, 2 March 2025, Porsche will be represented at the Stuttgart exhibition centre with a special selection of exhibits. The exhibition creates a tension between the past of the brand and its innovative present. "Our work in the Porsche Heritage and Museum department is aimed at making the past ready for the future, today. The iconic models at the centre of the Porsche trade fair stand impressively demonstrate how closely the history of the brand is linked to its future," says Achim Stejskal, Head of Porsche Heritage and Museum. "We also invite visitors to get to know our Porsche Heritage and Museum team better."



#### Light weight and with a naturally aspirated V10 engine

On Sunday, 2 March 2025, the Porsche Museum invites you to a panel discussion with prominent guests at 11:00 a.m.. Le Mans winner and brand ambassador Timo Bernhard and former racing engineer Norbert Singer talk to Armin Burger, Coordinator of Historic Motorsport, about the longdistance racing successes of the Porsche brand and a special project that was brought back to life a few weeks ago: the Porsche Le Mans Prototype 2000, LMP 2000 for short. Originally designed to win at Le Mans, the ambitious project was discontinued 26 years ago during the development phase for cost reasons. After 78 test kilometres, a tarpaulin was thrown over the car in 1999 and it went into storage for more than two decades. That was until the Porsche Heritage and Museum team got the LMP 2000 ready to drive again a guarter of a century after the first rollout. The facts about the LMP 2000, which was once developed for the Le Mans prototype class LMP900: 452 kW (615 PS), 5.5 litre displacement, V10-cylinder naturally aspirated engine. The presentation at the trade fair stand is its first official appearance after the car was presented last year.

The Porsche Carrera GT, which is celebrating its 25th birthday this year, is no less impressive. The study of the mid-engine sports car was presented in Paris in September 2000. The Carrera GT shares not only the V10-cylinder naturally aspirated engine, which can also be seen on the Porsche stand, with the LMP 2000, but also the idea of an innovative lightweight construction. The body and monocogue chassis of the Carrera GT are made of carbon fibre and carbon-fibre-reinforced plastic. With its design and performance, the Carrera GT embodies Porsche DNA: a combination of racing technology and driving experience. Together with the LMP 2000, it shows how closely innovation and tradition are linked at Porsche.

#### The Porsche 959 celebrates its 40th birthday

With the Porsche 959, the company not only set another technical milestone, but also pushed the limits of what is technically feasible in automotive construction. Between 1986 and 1988, only 292 models of the super sports car, with its groundbreaking aerodynamic properties, were produced. Its 2.8-litre biturbo six-cylinder engine delivered 331 kW (450 PS) and was capable of a top speed of 315 km/h. This makes the 959 one of the fastest series production cars of its time. With its blend of groundbreaking technology and luxurious equipment, the 959 is not only a super sports car, but also a technology champion that embodies the manufacturer's engineering skills. The 959 has long been a legend that laid the foundation for modern super sports cars in the 1980s.

#### Sixty years of the Targa success story

Another attraction at Retro Classics is the Targa Duo, which Porsche is using to celebrate the 60-year success story of this iconic body variant. At its trade fair stand, the sports car manufacturer will present a Porsche 911 2.0 Targa "soft window" from 1967 and the current 911 Targa 4S Heritage Design



Edition of the 992 generation. Both demonstrate how Porsche combines tradition and modernity. In 1965, Porsche exhibited the second body variant of the 911, which was still young at the time, at the International Motor Show in Frankfurt. To this day, the idea of the Targa continues to weave its way through all generations of the 911. With the models of the Heritage Design Edition, it is important to preserve the tradition of the brand and to reinterpret it for the future. Each edition dips into the history of Porsche with design features — and interprets them in a contemporary way.

#### Porsche provides insight into historical work

Over the four days of the trade fair, Porsche will not only present special exhibits, but also explain what the motto "Mission Future Heritage" means. The Porsche Heritage and Museum team will present all aspects of their area. In conjunction with this, a very special talk will be held on Saturday, 1 March 2025, at 14:00. With Timo Bernhard as presenter; Alexander Klein, Head of Heritage Operations and Communications; Frank Jung, Head of Corporate Archives and Collections; and Denis Behn, team coordinator visitor services, will give insights into their work. This way, guests can find out firsthand what is happening behind the scenes.

In addition, Porsche invites visitors to experience history and innovation first-hand and interactively. A screen allows interested fans to "get into" cars or stroll through the museum shop. In addition to this 360-degree tour, Porsche will also present the company archive at the stand. The Porsche Heritage and Museum team will be showing selected archive exhibits to match the cars on display. Visitors can look forward to design models of the Porsche 911 Targa and Porsche 959, as well as posters, drawings and the helmets and racing suits of motorsport stars such as Stéphane Ortelli and Allan McNish. Based on the motto "Heritage Worldwide", the museum uses a large world map to show where the cars from the collection are currently located: at driving events, rallies and as part of the Heritage Experience event programme. To complement the map, the Porsche Museum shows pictures and films of the missions. The museum shop incorporated into the exhibition stand offers visitors selected products from the brand — a souvenir of a special day at Retro Classics.

At this year's Retro Classics event in Hall 3, Porsche is presenting selected 911 models. The new platform RARE.SPHERE creates space for real encounters and is intended to represent the "zeitgeist" / spirit of the age of the younger generations. Here, the sports car manufacturer will exhibit the 911 Turbo RSR 2.1. The exhibited 911, from 1974, was the first of its kind with a turbocharger and the first Porsche racing car with a turbo engine at the 24 Hours of Le Mans.

On 27 February, Porsche will be represented at the trade fair from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.. From 28 February to 2 March, guests will be welcome from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m..
